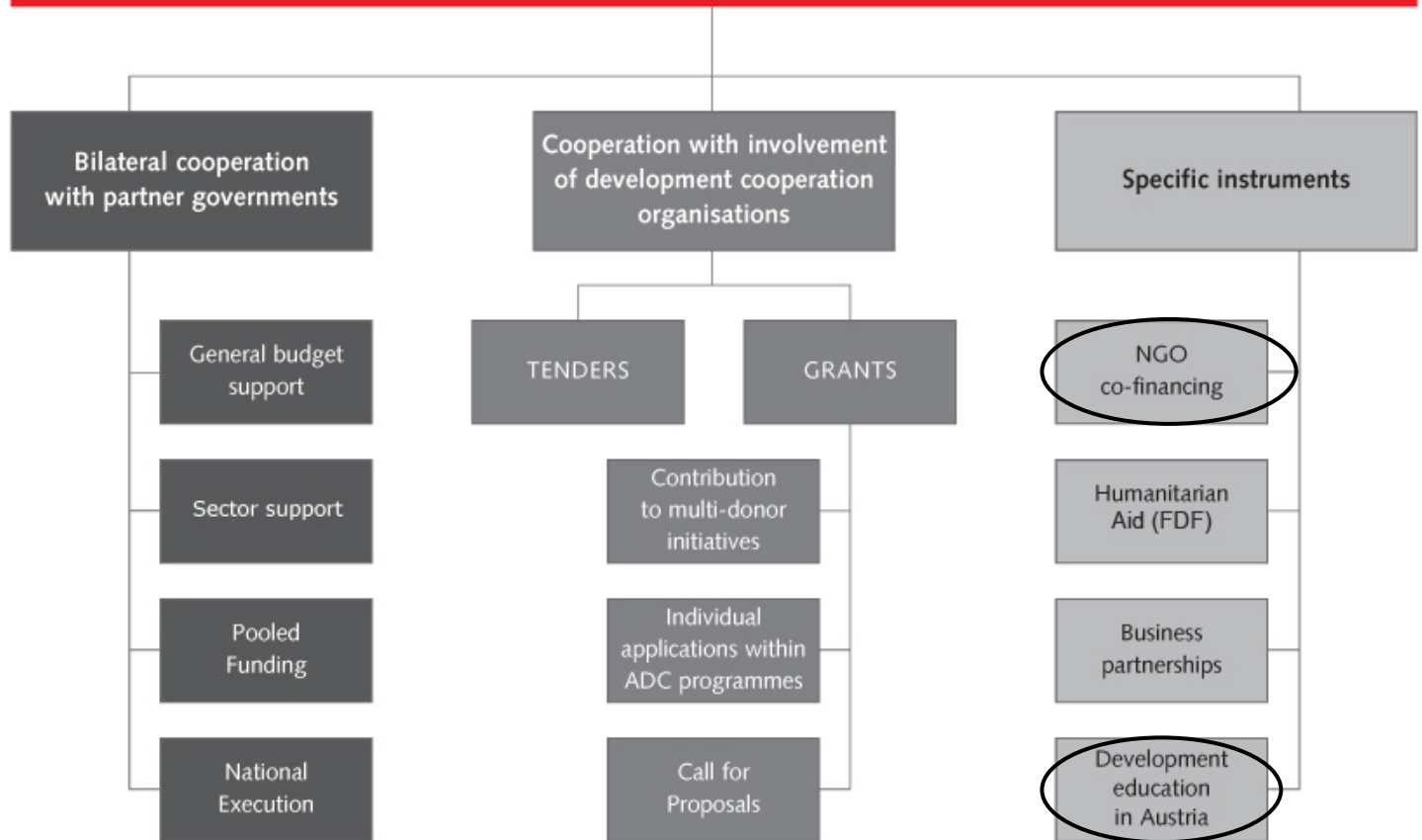

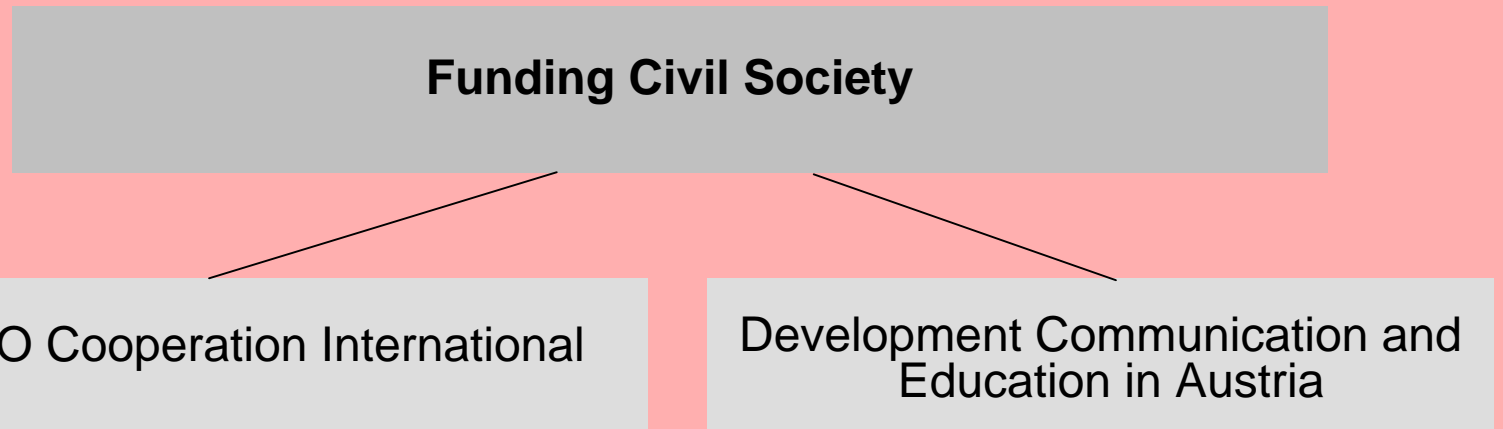

Conditions for cofinancing

- Right of initiative
- NGOs contribute with a percentage of own funds to the project costs
- Projects / programmes carried out together with a local implementing partner



NGO Cooperation EU Co-financing



- Aims of projects
- Eligibility of applicants
- Geographical focus
- Thematic focus – quality criteria
- Budgetary criteria
- Application/reporting procedure
- Funding relevant EC budget lines
